St. Augustine High School is a Catholic, college preparatory high school for young men grades 9-12. Our mission is to provide a Catholic liberal arts education for young men in an environment that promotes the development of mind, heart, and body in the Augustinian tradition. By helping to form loving disciples of Jesus Christ we communicate to the world the gospel values of Community, Truth, and Love. At Saints, we are intent on preparing young men to live in both the City of God and the City of Man. The school was founded in 1922, by the Order of St. Augustine.

Saints has an enrollment of approximately 700 young men from the greater San Diego and Tijuana area with a rich ethnic and racial mix. The average class size is 25 young men from a variety of socio-economic backgrounds and neighborhoods. Many students come long distances each day to attend school, including those who cross the international border each day.

WE STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT STUDENTS DO NOT TAKE MORE THAN FOUR AP COURSES DURING AN ACADEMIC YEAR. Taking the AP test is required of those students taking an AP class. Eighty percent of seniors are enrolled in one AP course.

Academic Marking System:

Following is the semester grading scale used by the entire teaching staff to indicate student achievement:

A - Excellent (90-100% of the points in the course)

B - Above Average (80-89% of the points in the course)

C - Average (70-79% of the points in the course)

D - Below Average (65-69% of the points in the course)

F - Failing (below 65% of the points in the course)

For grade points: A=4; B=3; C=2; D=1; F=0. A bonus point is added for grades of A, B, and C in honors and AP courses.
