# ALUMNI Director's Message

So just what exactly is going on at Saints with all this new construction, you ask? If you haven't driven by Saints lately, I can't blame you for asking, as between now and September, Saints is working towards concluding its biggest facelift in over 50 years. As I'm certain you know by now, the Phase I renovation project (designed by local architect Tony Cutri '69) at the southwest corner of campus is well under way and over 50% complete. DPR Construction, the general contractor, reports we are on schedule for a Fall 2007 opening. With framing now taking place, students, parents, faculty and staff are beginning to get a real sense of what the mass and design of the finished facility will be.

Naturally, the most ambitious building campaign in school history has caused quite a bit of excitement in the school community and for good reason. When completed, the typical classroom will increase to over 900sf (from 736sf) and total building space will nearly double to a total of just under 40,000sf.

But that's not all that will be happening when classes end June 7.

Sullivan Hall (built in 1947) and Sheehan Hall (built in 1952 and expanded in 1953) will be razed along with four modular buildings and a new auxiliary athletic field will go in to replace the old lower field which was lost to the new construction. The field, to be used by sports teams, PE classes, and the intramural program, is expected to be ready for use in January 2008 once the sod is firmly in place.

A surface parking lot will be located between Dougherty Gym and the new field which will more than double total campus off-street parking when combined with the parking structure built below the new classroom buildings.

That's quite a lot of work you say? It certainly is but it's not ending there.

# Augustinians Elect Fr. Gary Sanders, OSA '67 Prior Provincial in California

In a recent election, the Augustinians of the Province of St. Augustine in California chose Fr. Gary Sanders OSA '67 as the sixth Provincial of the Western Province.

Fr. Gary was born in San Diego on October 2, 1949, one of five children of Curtis and Helen Sanders. Don, John, Gary, Jim and Helen attended St. Rita's parochial school. The four boys graduated from Saints.

Immediately following graduation in 1967 Gary Sanders entered the Augustinian Pre-Novitiate Program, of which Fr. John Keller, OSA '55 was the acting formation director. Gary professed vows to the Order in 1970. Since his 1975 ordination, Fr. Gary has served in formation work, as Vocation Director, as pastor of St. Patrick's Church in San Diego, and as a high school teacher and administrator at Villanova Preparatory School in Ojai. Presently, he is pastor of Our Mother of Good Counsel Church in Hollywood.

Not only is Father Sanders a graduate of Saints, but his brother Fr. John '66 was principal here for ten years. Subsequently, Fr. Gary has been the chaplain at some of the St. Augustine High School class retreats. Last spring he was chaplain of a Kairos retreat for seniors.

He says, "When I saw them in action, I felt such pride in knowing that the Saints' community continues not just to exist but to thrive. They are great people." As a member of the Board of Trustees, he holds those who serve our school in great respect commenting, "One can only be impressed by the membership of this Board and how well it functions. It is always exciting to be around people like these who share in a common love for the Saints tradition. I look forward to working with Saints even more closely in the years ahead."

At Vasey Hall, site of the original campus built in 1922-23, interior renovation will take place in all areas except the main office and chapel to further provide space for classrooms and school operations. (I mention "interior" renovation as the exteriors of these Richard Requa designed buildings will remain unchanged.)

Fine arts space will more than double as sculpting, painting and drawing classes move into the area presently occupied by the library. Band space will be expanded and take over rooms 5 and 6 which will be combined into one large area to include private practice rooms and storage for instruments and uniforms.

Classrooms 1 and 2 will be converted into a multi-use space separated by a partition wall that can be rolled back to accommodate group meetings for up to 50 people when classes are not being held. Rooms 3 and 4 will be redesigned and provide space for an ASB office/classroom, President's office, conference room, and public restroom facilities.

That, in a nutshell, brings you up to date with what's going on construction-wise at Saints in 2007. It's an impressive list of improvements that has us all anxiously awaiting the start of the 2007-08 school year.

--Varsity Football Back-to-Back CIF Champs Saints Athletics Update

The Saints varsity football team captured its second straight CIF championship with a 17-7 victory over Point Loma at Qualcomm Stadium in early December. The team went 10-3 (4-1 in the tough Eastern League) before running the table in the playoffs with wins over Brawley, El Capitan, and the Pointers, whom they also beat in the 2005 title game.

Among the wins was a thrilling 31-23 game over arch-rival Cathedral Catholic. The high-scoring team put up more than 50 points three times during the season.

Saintsmen voted to the All-CIF team included UCLA-bound quarterback Chris Forcier, running back Leitch James, linebacker Bobby Erskine, and WR/DB Larry Parker. Meanwhile, the JV squad went 8-2 and the Freshmen finished 9-6.

The Cross Country team finished third in League and fourth in CIF. For the first time in many moons, no Sainstmen made the CIF squad, though there was only one senior on the team.

Saints' very young Varsity basketball team has ended the regular season 10-14. They are the #4 seed in the CIF Championship Tournament. Among their wins was a huge upset of 7th-ranked Scripps Ranch in late January.

The JV hoopsters ended their season 22-3 and Western League Champs. The Freshman finished with a 21-4 record.

Over on the mats, the Wrestling team ended the season third in the league. Seniors Kellen Crisman and Greg Hansen have moved on to post-season competition.

The Soccer team posted a 14-4-5 regular season record and is seeded #3 in the CIF Championship Tournament. They are led by Matt Crimi, Anthony Barrack, Nate Wojtach and Quinn Daly.

The JV soccer team finished the year at 11-4-3, and the Frosh squad was 12-2-2.

#### Fr. John Glynn, OSA 1913 - 2006

Fr. John Glynn, OSA passed away on September 23, 2006 in Ojai, CA at age 93. He was born in Lawrence, MA and attended public schools there.



He attended the Augustinian Academy in Staten Island, NY for his preparation for the priesthood and religious life. He took his first vows in 1932 then attended Villanova College, graduating with a BA in Philosophy. From 1932 to 1936 he continued his studies at Augustinian College in Washington, DC and earned an MA in Classical Languages from Catholic University of America.

He was ordained to the priesthood on May 30, 1939. His first assignment was to Saints, where he taught from 1940 to 1959. During those years at various times he was also vice-principal, moderator of the Alumni Association, JV football coach, founder of CARRA, a social organization for San Diego's Catholic high schools and Latin teacher for the Diocesan seminarians. During his years at Saints he was affectionately known as "Coach."

After Saints, he undertook various assignments throughout California at Mater Dei in Santa Ana, Central Catholic in Modesto and Ojai College Prep in Ojai. He was the founding co-principal and headmaster at the latter two schools respectively.
