#### The Final College List

- We recommend applying to 4 to 8 colleges:
  - 1 to 3 "Reaches"
  - 2 to 4 "Evens"
  - 1 to 3 "Pluses"
- Use the Scattergrams in Scoir to determine if a college is a Plus, Even, or Reach for your son.

#### Factors in College Admission

#### Top Factors of Considerable Importance

- HS Grades
- Strength of curriculum
- Application Essay or Personal Statement
- Demonstrated interest ... at some schools
- Letters of recommendation
- Extracurricular activities
- Admission test scores ... ?!
- Interview



- Many colleges will be test optional this year, but check directly on each colleges' website. For a list of test optional schools, visit www.fairtest.org
- UC, CSU, USD are examples of "test blind" or "test free" schools
- We recommend that you take an SAT or ACT if possible, but don't panic if you can't get it in.
- If needed Register for SAT (www.collegeboard.org) and/or ACT (www.act.org) ASAP!
- December is final test that can be used for most colleges (November for EA or ED applications)

## Testing Reminders

- The "usual advice" If he did better on one test or the other—SAT or ACT—that is the test he repeats, and submits. For this year... consult with your counselor about submitting a test to a particular college.
- Fee Waivers are available for low-income families that meet the requirements. Contact your counselor if you think you might qualify.
- The earlier you register the more likely you will get a favorable testing location.
- Saints will be hosting the SAT exam on October 11



- California State Universities (CSU)
  - Cal State Apply
  - CSU applications will "go live" on Oct.
    1<sup>st</sup>
  - No SAT or ACT accepted -Test Blind
  - One application per campus
  - Deadline is Nov 30<sup>th</sup> (but don't wait until then!)
  - <u>No essay required</u>, just GPA and SAT/ACT test scores
  - No letters of recommendation accepted



- University of California (UC)
  - admissions.universityofcalifornia.edu
  - UC application is available now, can be sent beginning Oct. 1
  - Deadline is November 30th
  - No SAT or ACT accepted -Test Blind
  - One application for all campuses
  - Must answer <u>4 of 8</u> Personal Insight Questions
  - Application also includes space for activities & awards





- The Common Application is used by over 1,000 colleges nationwide
- The majority of private schools, and select state universities use the Common App for their application
- The Common Application requires:
  - One teacher letter of recommendation (some need 2)
  - One counselor letter of recommendation
  - One essay (selected from choice of 7)
  - Some schools will have supplemental questions or essays specific to their school that must be written

# Other Applications

 Applications for many state institutions will be completed directly on that school's website (i.e. Grand Canyon, New Mexico, Boise State, etc.)

\*Use Common Application for schools when possible to save time

#### Create Calendar for Deadlines

- University of California November 30<sup>th</sup>
- California State Universities November 30<sup>th</sup>
- Common Application Schools Dates vary
  - Ex 1: University of San Diego December 1st
  - Ex 2: Villanova University January 15th
  - Ex 3: University of Michigan February 1st
  - Ex 4: Arizona State University Rolling Admissions (Nov 1st Priority)

\*Don't forget Early Action/Early Decision deadlines!



## Application notes

- Most students will apply between September and early January
- Counselors are available to help students with their applications <u>during office hours, at lunch</u>, and <u>after</u> <u>school</u>
- When applying online, make sure to download a copy of the application, and the proof of payment for your records

#### Scoir

- Seniors should begin adding the schools to the "applying" list so counselors know to send documents to those schools
- Register for visits from approximately 100 colleges representatives to Saints this fall
- New career assessment tool
- Request letters of recommendation through SCOIR

# Letters of Recommendation

- Letters are not accepted for UC/CSU
- Letters must be <u>requested through Scoir</u>
- Give plenty of notice to teachers and counselor. Letters may go in before or after applications are sent
- Please use 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade teachers if at all possible.
- "Thank you" notes are important.

# **Financial Aid**

- ► The FAFSA is the key to all college financial aid
- FAFSAs are to be submitted after December 1<sup>st</sup> using the previous years tax return
- The CSS PROFILE is required by many private colleges and some public universities, check to see if they want this form, which should be filled out in October. <u>www.collegeboard.com</u>
- We will file the Cal Grant GPA Verification for all seniors automatically.

- Check your workplace for scholarships.
- ROTC scholarships should be done ASAP.
- Check the colleges for merit money.
