Planning ahead is the key to success when it comes to the SAT. The College Board has announced the upcoming test dates for the 2025–2026 school year, with opportunities offered in October, November, and December of 2025, and again in March, May, and June of 2026.

SAT Test Dates

Each test date comes with its own registration and late registration deadlines, so students are encouraged to review the schedule carefully and mark their calendars early.

Taking the SAT is a milestone in the college admissions process, and timely registration ensures students have the best chance to secure their preferred testing location. Families are also reminded to check the College Board website regularly for updates and details on preparation resources.

A tireless volunteer at Saints and an original inductee into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame, Coach John also built an extraordinary six-decade career at the University of San Diego, serving in various posts, including Head Baseball Coach for 25 years.

We pause to acknowledge and recognize the passing of John Cunningham earlier this month.

A Saints alum from the class of 1955, John Cunningham was a standout basketball and baseball player.

He went on to play both basketball and baseball at the University of San Francisco.

Following his playing career, he returned to San Diego and worked for nearly 60 years at USD. He held a variety of positions, including 25 years as the head baseball coach. In 1993, the City of San Diego honored him by putting him on a list of the 25 most influential San Diegans in baseball – a list that includes Tony Gwynn and Ted Williams. In 1995, John Cunningham was part of the first-ever St. Augustine Athletic Hall of Fame induction class.

9-11 Survivor Addresses Students

On September 4, just one week before the anniversary of the September 11 attacks, the Saints community gathered in the gymnasium to hear an unforgettable presentation from Mr. Kevin Shaeffer. A survivor of the Pentagon strike on 9/11, Mr. Shaeffer spoke for nearly an hour, recounting his extraordinary story of resilience, patriotism, and courage.

As a Navy Lieutenant assigned to the Pentagon's Navy Command Center, Mr. Shaeffer narrowly survived when American Airlines Flight 77 crashed directly through his office. Severely burned and facing overwhelming odds, he endured a long recovery and went on to serve with distinction on the 9/11 Commission and later at the CIA, where he contributed to the team that located Osama bin Laden

Students and faculty were riveted as Mr. Shaeffer shared not just his survival, but the deeper lessons of service and perseverance that shaped his career and life. His visit was made possible through the vision and leadership of Mr. O'Beirn, whose efforts brought this important event to campus.

The morning served as a profound reminder to "Never Forget" the sacrifices of 9/11 and to carry forward the spirit of courage that defines true service.

#67 Danny Ramirez is currently teaching locally at Holy Trinity school in El Cajon and coaching Saints JV and Varsity football.







Saints 2025 Cross Country Season Preview

Interview with Varsity Cross Country Coach Mr. Christian Yoakum

1. How did the Saints off season preparation go?

Summer preparation for cross country is always a little bit of an unknown. We have runners that leave San Diego for the summer, some take a much-needed rest from a grueling track or baseball season, some live in Tijuana, and many work or participate in internship opportunities. Fortunately, cross country is a sport where athletes can train on their own. This summer we offered summer conditioning three days a week beginning in mid-June and had around 12 runners that were able to make consistently. We had a camp/retreat at the end of July for our top 8 runners to train at altitude for a week and bond as a team. The camp was very successful and capped off a very productive summer for our varsity runners.

2. Can you share some brief info on senior team leaders?

This year's team has two talented senior leaders; Jamie Gerding and Peter Jordan. Jamie is a 4-year varsity letterman with four years of experience running at the CIF championships. He brings experience, quiet leadership and a calming demeaner to the team. Jamie is a runner who does not get rattled and has his best races when they count the most. He understands peaking at the right point in the season is the goal.

Peter is a 2-year varsity letterman with two years of experience running on the CIF championship team. Peter is a talented 800-meter track runner as well and brings a lot of speed to cross country. Peter was our lead runner last season and is expecting to do so again this year. Peter brings confidence, experience and a knowledge of what it takes to be the best.

3. What excites you most about the upcoming season?

The most exciting thing for me about the upcoming season is the unknown. The team is a combination of experience from our 2024 state qualifying team (Jamie Gerding, Peter Jordan and junior Nico Sanchez) and a collection of young runners with talent but no varsity experience. Right now, the expectations from other teams and coaches is very low due to the influx of new runners; for the first time in 4 years we are not the favorite to win the Eastern league. I feel, however, that this team can be outstanding. Each year our team goal is to win league and challenge for a CIF championship and this year is no different. While we do not have a lot of experience, I do feel both goals are well within reach of this team.

We will share St. Carlo's story with our student body on Oct. 2nd and are excited that the film's Director Jim Wahlberg (older brother of actor Mark Wahberg) will be with us to share his own powerful testimony of faith with Saintsmen. We are hopeful the film will strengthen our shared mission to form young men of virtue, wisdom, and faith.




Farewell and Thanks to a Life Well Lived
