If you're a fan of sports trivia, 1954 offered its share of milestones. That spring, England's Roger Bannister stunned the world by running the first sub-four-minute mile in official competition. (For the record, Morocco's Hicham El Guerrouj pushed the boundary even further in 1999 with a 3:43 mile.)

Later that year, the San Diego Padres—then a minor-league club—captured the Pacific Coast League pennant by defeating the Hollywood Stars. San Diegan Maureen "Little Mo" Connolly claimed the Wimbledon title, and 1954 also ushered in the dawn of live television coverage for major sporting events.




Closer to home, St. Augustine High School launched a tradition destined to endure: the inaugural Turkey Trot, run through the neighborhood streets of North Park in the fall of 1954. No television cameras were rolling, but the Saintsman yearbook preserved the moment with the first published photograph of Saintsmen lining up for that maiden race.

More than seventy years later, the fabled Turkey Trot remains a beloved 1.5—mile dash through North Park. Little has changed except one quaint custom—the champion no longer goes home with a live turkey. Today, every runner is rewarded the modern way: with turkey pot pies and a heaping helping of bragging rights.







The program has captured seven straight Western League titles, ten CIF championships overall, and an unprecedented three consecutive Open Division CIF crowns. Saints also remains the only San Diego school ever to win the Division I State Championship, claiming statewide titles in 2012, 2021, and 2024.

After graduating more than twenty seniors in the last two years, this year's squad is young but fiercely committed. Our Saintsmen train daily with the knowledge that every opponent on the schedule is a Division I powerhouse.

The season opens on December 3 against Torrey Pines, followed by a December 12 home match with Loyola of Los Angeles. After Christmas, we travel to Irvine for the SoCal College Showcase, where we will meet three elite all-boys programs: Bellarmine Prep of San Jose, Santiago of Corona (whom we defeated in the 2021 State final), and Brophy Prep of Phoenix. All Showcase matches will be played at the stadium field at Chapman University.

Our final test before entering league play comes against Del Norte—another rising Division I challenger we have defeated in the last two Open Division championship games. It promises to be a measuring-stick match for both teams.

This demanding preseason is designed with purpose. It sharpens our competitive edge and prepares our young men for the grind of Western League play, where every opponent aims to unseat the champs. Leadership will come from senior Andre Odish and our dozen senior veterans, along with returning standout Maximo Piancone—an All-Western League selection last year—and promising sophomore Emilio Ybarra.

Most importantly, this group loves playing for each other and for the Saints community. Their pride, work ethic, and commitment to excellence continue the winning tradition that has defined Saints Soccer for more than a decade.

We all know what this looks like: a student gets a bad grade in a class or is confronted for a disciplinary infraction, and within seconds is on the phone home. This could have a positive benefit if the message from home is, "Thanks for the heads-up, and good luck working through the issue with your teacher or assistant principal." However, the response is often, "I will help you straighten things out right away."

In an era of instant access and the quick fix, we rarely afford our children the opportunity to sit reflectively with their own problems. Working through a challenging issue for a teenage boy requires thought, perspective, and reflection on what the adults he respects and values might have done. Rather than ask important questions to provide perspective, we tend to jump in with both feet and attempt to solve their problems for them.

There is a delicate balance. We want our children to be happy and fulfilled, but we occasionally create the opposite effect. For our Saintsmen to develop into resilient, compassionate, and thoughtful adults, they need latitude to work through their own issues, to see the world from a variety of perspectives, and to develop their own voice. If we constantly invade their space, they have little room to grow and mature into the strong, independent adults we want them to be.

Our desire to help students develop a passion for learning can sometimes be difficult to accomplish in traditional college prep classes. Providing students the opportunity to investigate studies in areas that interest them sparks a curiosity and inquisitiveness that naturally stimulates their desire to learn new things. Offering courses like Christian service in a cultural context, marine biology, architecture, small business management, sailing, cooking, and a host of internship opportunities, will give the students new and unique opportunities to discover a passion and/or skill set that they may embrace well beyond high school.

The Intersession term for the 2025-2026 school year begins on January 5, 2026, and ends on January 30, 2026. Martin Luther King Day will be observed on January 19, 2026.

All Intersession courses are a significant part of the graduation requirements for St. Augustine High School. Regular attendance during Intersession is also necessary for a meaningful learning experience. Since Intersession courses are compacted semester courses, students should not miss more than two days of Intersession. Please be aware, if a student is absent three (3) days from an Intersession course, he may be denied credit in that class thus affecting his graduation credits required for the St. Augustine High School diploma.

Every Wednesday during Intersession, school begins with Mass followed by the courses in which students are enrolled. Please note that "Tie Day" attire will be observed on all Mass days. For those students enrolled in courses that take place on campus, each school day will take place from 7:45 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Those students enrolled in courses that take place off campus should consult with their faculty supervisor to verify daily start and finish times.

During Intersession, every course which includes those taught on campus, as well as those that take place off campus, (i.e., sports/athletics, internships, and travel courses) will follow ALL regular school policies with respect to grades, attendance, standards of dress, and student discipline.
